God Has Spoken/Jesus Is Greater Than Angels

1 In the past God spoke to our forefathers through the prophets at many times and in various ways, 2 but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, and through whom he made the universe. 3 The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the *exact representation of his being*, sustaining all things by his powerful word. After he had provided purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty in heaven. 4 So he became as much **superior** to the angels as the name he has inherited is **superior** to theirs. (Col 1:13-20)

5 For to which of the angels did God ever say, "You are my Son; today I have become your Father"? (Ps 2:7)

Or again, "I will be his Father, and he will be my Son"? (2 Sam 7:13)

6 And again, when God brings his firstborn into the world, he says, "Let all God's angels worship him." (Ps 97:7)

7 In speaking of the angels he says, "He makes his angels winds, his servants flames of fire." (Ps 104:4)

8 But about the Son he says,

"Your throne, O God, will last for ever and ever, and righteousness will be the scepter of your kingdom. 9 You have loved righteousness and hated wickedness; therefore God, your God, has set you above your companions by anointing you with the oil of joy." (Ps 45:6-7)

10 He also says,

"In the beginning, O Lord, you laid the foundations of the earth, and the heavens are the work of your hands. 11 They will perish, but you remain; they will all wear out like a garment. 12 You will roll them up like a robe; like a garment they will be changed. But you remain the same, and your years will never end." (Ps 102:25-27)

13 To which of the angels did God ever say, "Sit at my right hand until I make your enemies a footstool for your feet"? (Ps 110:1)

14 Are not all angels ministering spirits sent to serve those who will inherit salvation?

Hebrews 2:1-4 - The 1st Warning

Some time ago I received an E-mail saying, “When you find a penny, an angel has tossed it to the ground when you’re frowning to give you a smile.” At the end of the message it said, “I hope that you feel as lucky as I do, as I am so very fortunate to be graced with angels such as you in my life.”

What Are Angels?

What is an angel? When we review the Bible we see four main words used to describe angels. In *The New Strong's Exhaustive Concordance of the Bible* we find the words *cherubim* (Strong's Hebrew [H] number 3742) or *seraphim* (H8314) refer to powerful winged creatures that do God's bidding. Also in the Old Testament the word *malak* (H4397) appears about 195 times and most often is translated as “angel or messenger.” In the New Testament we primarily see the word *angelos* (Greek 32), which also is primarily translated as “angel.” Some of the purposes of angels are to proclaim key events, provide protection and enforce God's wrath.

Generally, throughout the Bible when the word *angel* occurs, the

Some people have a near obsession or near worship of angels. Angels are real, but one must be cautious about giving the credit to angels when the real credit for miracles and answered prayers should go to God!

Angel worship has been around a long time. Colossians 2:18 (KJV) states: “Let no man beguile you of your reward in a voluntary humility and worshipping of angels, intruding into those things which he hath not seen, vainly puffed up by his fleshly mind” (see also verse 8).

As Christians we adhere to the Commandments and should be reminded of the First Commandment: “You shall have no other gods before Me” (Exodus 20:3).

The apostle John records this caution about bowing down to or giving more credit to angels (or anyone) than is due: “And I fell at his feet to worship him. But he said to me, ‘See that you do not do that!

all evil, but is all too often a blend of good and evil. There is often a dark side to the “cute” and “comical” of the world.

Each of us needs to beware of deception that can come in many forms, for our adversaries are powerful.

People perceive Satan as a funny caricature with a pitchfork or as an ugly, fearsome-looking creature. Most images we have are from art and Hollywood. Yet the Bible says Satan appears as an angel of light to deceive (2 Corinthians 11:14).

In the book of Daniel we see a great struggle between good and evil in the spirit realm. In Daniel 10:12-14 (New Living Bible) it says, “Then he said, ‘Don’t be afraid, Daniel. Since the first day you began to pray for understanding and to humble yourself before your God, your request has been heard in heaven. I have come in answer to your prayer. But for twenty-one days the spirit prince of the kingdom of Persia blocked my way. Then Michael, one of the archangels, came to help me, and I left him there with the spirit prince of the kingdom of Persia. Now I am here to explain what will happen to your people in the future, for this vision concerns a time yet to come.’”

Man—a Special Creation

God created angels and sometimes they are referred to as sons of God, but what about man? Does a man become an angel? The answer is a resounding, No!

At this time we barely comprehend our future glory (1 Corinthians 13:12). We have been made a little lower than the angels, but will be changed in the twinkling of an eye at the resurrection and will truly be made glorified sons of God (Hebrews 2:6-8; 1 John 3:2; 1 Corinthians 15:50-52).

Angels Bring God's Wrath and Protection

Angels are messengers. Angels are used to announce great events such as the pronouncement to

rounding them. But Elisha knew God's protection was already there, saying, “‘Do not fear, for those who

are with us are more than those who are with them.’ And Elisha prayed, and said, ‘LORD, I pray, open his eyes that he may see.’ Then the LORD opened the eyes of the young man, and he saw. And behold, the mountain was full of horses and chariots of fire all around Elisha.” Then the Syrian army was struck with blindness and sent back toward Samaria without capturing Elisha.

Each one of us can call upon God and pray to God for protection through His Spirit and His ministering angels. We have a promise from God in Psalm 91:10-11, “No evil shall befall you, nor shall any plague come near your dwelling; for He shall give His angels charge over you, to keep you in all your ways.”

Many of us have our personal stories to tell about how we feel God sent angels to deliver us from dangerous situations. These were situations where someone inadvertently got into trouble. We would never want to foolishly do something just to tempt or test God (Matthew 4:7).

The Truth About Angels

God created angels as ministering spirits, but some rebelled at the behest of Satan. However, most remained loyal. God's angels truly bring protection, announcements of great events and warnings before enforcing God's wrath. They are powerful beings who do God's bidding and are never to be worshipped.

The truth about angels has been twisted and distorted into a confusing assortment of fables and myths. People have wanted their senses titillated and they like to hear smooth things that lack true spiritual substance.

So often there is a constant barrage of falsehood that even true Christians must guard their thoughts, actions and beliefs. God alone is worthy of worship (Isaiah 37:16)!

Do not let anyone take your crown through false religion, philosophy or the inordinate esteem or worship of angels.

This too would be viewed as cute by many, and most realize that the fact that it is cute does not mean it is true. Still, too many people carelessly base their beliefs on what they've always heard or what sounds good.

If you explore the subject of angels in literature and on the Internet, most of what you find is based on fables, myths and popular suppositions (1 Timothy 1:4).

We hear stories about guardian angels, angels of protection in time of war and people being helped by angels.

There are movies like *Angels in the Outfield* or *Michael* or TV's *Touched by an Angel*. There are collectible angels, angel booklets and sand pictures of angels. There is

More Credit Than Due

Many people want to give angels credit. It is as if people want their own little cherub, baby cupid or powerful angel with wings to lift them from adversity or to do their own bidding in personal affairs. They often do this without ever calling on God for help. Some people look to angels almost as their own personal geniuses.

I am your fellow servant . . .” (Revelation 19:10, see also Revelation 22:8-9).

Gnosticism teaches that angels are necessary intermediaries between God and man. This false teaching claims that knowing about angels enables “one to gain blessings in this life and attain the level of divine in the next” (*Holman Bible Dictionary*).

Let us never forget that Christ alone is our mediator before God (1 Timothy 2:5).

We Are in Spiritual Warfare

As Christians, we know we are in a spiritual warfare and our battle is not against flesh and blood, as the apostle Paul warned (Ephesians 6:12). Deception is never blatantly

- 1. God's angels are described as:** Are not all angels **ministering spirits sent to serve those who will inherit salvation?** (Heb 1:14)
- 2. All of the angels were created by Jesus:** For by him [Jesus] all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and **invisible**, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; **all things were created by him** and for him. (Col 1:16)
- 3. Angels are powerful spirit beings:** God is just: He will pay back trouble to those who trouble you and give relief to you who are troubled, and to us as well. This will happen when the Lord Jesus is revealed from heaven in blazing fire with **his powerful angels**. (2 Th 1:6,7)
Yet even angels, although they are **stronger and more powerful** , do not bring slanderous accusations against such beings in the presence of the Lord. (2 Pet 2:11)
- 4. Angels do not marry and have baby angels:** At the resurrection people will **neither marry nor be given in marriage; they will be like the angels in heaven**. (Mat 22:30)
Since angels are created beings **there are no baby angels** , in spite of all the pictures you might have seen that show otherwise. Artists that draw fat, little, baby angels do this without any Biblical support at all.
- 5. God's angels worship Jesus:** And again, when God brings his firstborn into the world, he says, "Let **all God's angels worship him** [Jesus]." (Heb 1:6)
- 6. God's angels obey Him:** Praise the LORD, you his angels, you mighty ones who **do his bidding, who obey his word**. (Psa. 103:20)
- 7. God's angels praise Him:** Praise him, all his angels, praise him, all his heavenly hosts. (Psa. 148:2)
- 8. God's angels refuse to receive worship:** Then the angel said to me, "Write: 'Blessed are those who are invited to the wedding supper of the Lamb!' " And he added, "These are the true words of God." At this I fell at his feet to worship him. But he said to me, "**Do not do it!** I am a fellow servant with you and with your brothers who hold to the testimony of Jesus. Worship God! For the testimony of Jesus is the spirit of prophecy." (Rev 19:9,10)
And when I had heard and seen them, I fell down to worship at the feet of the angel who had been showing them to me. But he said to me, "**Do not do it!** I am a fellow servant with you and with your brothers the prophets and of all who keep the words of this book. Worship God!" (Rev. 22:8,9).
- 9. Angels attended Jesus after the devil's temptations:** Then the devil left him, and angels came and attended him. (Mat 4:11)
- 10. Jesus could have been delivered by legions of angels from his cruel death on the cross:** Do you think I cannot call on my Father, and he will at once put at my disposal **more than twelve legions of angels** ? (Mat 26:53)
- 11. Angels were present after Jesus rose from the grave:** But Mary stood outside the tomb crying. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb and saw two angels in white, seated where Jesus' body had been, one at the head and the other at the foot. (John 20:11,12)
- 12. Angels can guard the righteous:** For he will command his angels concerning you **to guard you** in all your ways; (Psa. 91:11)
- 13. Angels can bring deliverance:** My God sent his angel, and he shut the mouths of the lions. They have not hurt me, because I was found innocent in his sight. Nor have I ever done any wrong before you, O king. (Dan 6:22)
But during the night an angel of the Lord opened the doors of the jail and brought them out. (Acts 5:19)
- 14. God executes His Judgment through angels:** He unleashed against them his hot anger, his wrath, indignation and hostility -- **a band of destroying angels**. (Psa. 78:49)
- 15. Angels will be used to find everything that causes sin and all who do evil (the unsaved):** The Son of Man will send out **his angels**, and they will **weed out of his kingdom everything that causes sin and all who do evil**. (Mat 13:41)
- 16. Angels will throw people into the fiery furnace:** This is how it will be at the end of the age. **The angels will come and separate the wicked from the righteous and throw them into the fiery furnace, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth**. (Mat 13:49,50)
- 17. When Jesus returns He will come with angels:** For the Son of Man is going to come in his Father's glory with **his angels**, and then he will reward each person according to what he has done. (Mat 16:27)
- 18. Angels will gather the righteous at the point of the rapture:** And he will send **his angels** with a loud trumpet call, and they will **gather his elect** from the four winds, from one end of the heavens to the other. (Mat 24:31)

- 19. Upon their death, angels carry the righteous to their home in the afterlife:** The time came when the beggar died and the angels carried him to Abraham's side. The rich man also died and was buried. (Luke 16:22)
- 20. Angels observe the servants of God:** For it seems to me that God has put us apostles on display at the end of the procession, like men condemned to die in the arena. We have been made a spectacle to the whole universe, to angels as well as to men. (1 Cor 4:9)
- 21. Angels will be judged by Christians:** Do you not know that we will judge angels? How much more the things of this life! (1 Cor 6:3)
- 22. There are only two angels that are specifically given names in the Bible. The angel Gabriel is one and he is always bringing a message:** The angel answered, "I am Gabriel. I stand in the presence of God, and I have been sent to speak to you and to tell you this good news. (Luke 1:19)
- 23. The only other angel named in Scripture is Michael.** The archangel Michael (Jude 9) is a warring angel, but there are other archangels too (Dan. 10:13).
Yet in the future, Michael and his angels will fight against Satan [the dragon] and his angels:
And there was war in heaven. Michael and his angels fought against the dragon, and the dragon and his angels fought back. But he was not strong enough, and they lost their place in heaven. The great dragon was hurled down -- that ancient serpent called the devil, or Satan, who leads the whole world astray. He was hurled to the earth, and his angels with him. (Rev 12:7-9)
- 24. Children all have personal angels that appear before God. Though the words guardian angels are not found in this verse, such can be understood from Jesus' teaching:** See that you do not look down on one of these little ones. For I tell you that their angels in heaven always see the face of my Father in heaven. (Mat 18:10)
- 25. Angels can appear as people undetected:** Do not forget to entertain strangers, for by so doing some people have entertained angels without knowing it. (Heb 13:2)
- 26. An angel of God appeared to an unsaved man and accurately told him how to learn about God's salvation:** One day at about three in the afternoon he had a vision. He distinctly saw an angel of God, who came to him and said, "Cornelius!" Cornelius stared at him in fear. "What is it, Lord?" he asked. The angel answered, "Your prayers and gifts to the poor have come up as a memorial offering before God. And now send men to Joppa, and call for one Simon, whose surname is Peter: (Acts 10:3-5).
Angels are immortal: And they can no longer die; for they are like the angels. They are God's children, since they are children of the resurrection. (Luke 20:36)
- 27. One solitary angel of God will seize Satan, the great deceiver, and throw him into the Abyss during the 1,000 year reign of Christ:** And I saw an angel coming down out of heaven, having the key to the Abyss and holding in his hand a great chain. He seized the dragon, that ancient serpent, who is the devil, or Satan, and bound him for a thousand years. He threw him into the Abyss, and locked and sealed it over him, to keep him from deceiving the nations anymore until the thousand years were ended (Rev. 20:1-3).
- 28. During the Perfect Age, angels will be stationed as guards at the twelve gates entering New Jerusalem:** It had a great, high wall with twelve gates, and with twelve angels at the gates. On the gates were written the names of the twelve tribes of Israel. (Rev 21:12)
- 29. There are multitudes of angels in heaven in joyful assembly:** But you have come to Mount Zion, to the heavenly Jerusalem, the city of the living God. You have come to thousands upon thousands of angels in joyful assembly, (Heb 12:22)
- 30. Some people in Jesus' day did not believe in the existence of angels like in our day:** The Sadducees say that there is no resurrection, and that there are neither angels nor spirits, but the Pharisees acknowledge them all. (Acts 23:8)
- 31. False teachers can be involved in the worship of angels, which is always forbidden:** Do not let anyone who delights in false humility and the worship of angels disqualify you for the prize. Such a person goes into great detail about what he has seen, and his unspiritual mind puffs him up with idle notions. (Col 2:18)

It is also important to know that you should NEVER CALL ON AN ANGEL for guidance, deliverance, etc. To do so will open yourself up for spiritual deception. According to the Bible, we should ONLY call on God. We are also to TRUST ONLY IN GOD for deliverance, NOT AN ANGEL. While it is true that God might deliver us with angels it is still God who is our Rock, Fortress, Deliverer, etc. God commands his angels what to do and they obey Him.
